### SHADE THE TRAIL PLAQUE –

A plaque to commemorate the Shade the Trail Program has been completed at the corner of Honeysuckle and Blackberry. Thank you again to all our neighbors who contributed to this program.

#### **TREES**

Crowley Park loves their trees but we have been informed by the parks department that 7 trees (6 live oaks and 1 red oak) on the south side of the park along Lookout Dr need to be removed because they are experiencing Oak Wilt. The red oak spreads the disease via airborne spores while the live oaks contract it through their root system. New trees will be planted in the fall to replace the ones being removed. This is why as we chose trees for Shade the Trail, we did not put a lot of oaks together and mixed among them different types like cedar elms.

#### WATER FOUNTAIN

The water bowl feature on the fountain by the pond at the south end of the park was not working for our furry friends to get a drink of water. **WELL, IT IS FIXED** so our furry friends can quench their thirst again.

#### PARK IRRIGATION

Crews have been working hard at the park to repair irrigation. The irrigation and tree bubblers at the corner at Honeysuckle and Blackberry are now working. It will take a bit for that corner to recover, especially in this heat but we are making progress.

#### **PICNIC TABLE**

The metal picnic table on the deck by the pond has been repainted due to vandalism where different color paints were used on that table that could not be removed.

#### THE POND

Many of you wonder about the pond throughout the year and why it occasionally gets scummy-looking. The existing waterfall in the pond is meant to circulate the water very efficiently for our size pond and on most days works very well. Occasionally due to weather (especially the heat) or just the incidence of more algae, the pond appears scummy. The city has a pond expert visit the pond twice a month to inspect how things are functioning and looking. This size pond is too shallow for any fountain feature in the center of the pond. Our existing waterfall feature works much more effectively.

### Membership and Promotions Committee Chair: Steve and Donna Crane

Since the 2022 Annual Meeting, 52 new households joined prior to August 1st. During the August membership drive, 24 additional households joined CPNA. 63 households renewed their membership since August 1st.

During the membership drive, CPNA contacted all 1054 households in the CPNA area; delivered @ 950 flyers to homes, mailed over 100 flyers to homes with No Soliciting signs and emailed existing members. Two drawings were held for \$50 gift cards / certificates for members renewing or joining during the August membership drive.

The CPNA board decided to add a 10-year member option, at a price of \$150 cash / check or \$156 PayPal (covers the \$6 PayPal fee) in addition to the existing 1, 3 and 5-year options. This new option is now live for fiscal year 2023-2024.

Beginning with August 2024, all members will receive an email prior to the membership drive reminding them when their membership expires. This should eliminate any confusion on whether it is time for a household to renew. Since this year's membership drive has already concluded, each member will receive an email with their expiration date after Oct. 1 st
