Since the 2023 Annual Meeting, 18 new households joined prior to August 1st. During the August membership drive, 42 additional households joined CPNA. 88 households renewed their membership since August 1st.

During the membership drive, CPNA contacted all 1054 households in the CPNA area; delivered ~1000 flyers to homes, and emailed existing members. An ice cream social was held during the membership drive with ~185 persons attending and 173 servings served.

#### Civic & Environmental: Nancy Crowe

#### **CLEAN PARK INITIATIVE -**

Excess garbage and trash were becoming a real problem in Crowley Park. Several initiatives have taken place in conjunction with the Richardson Parks Department as follows:

- New Garbage Cans with greater capacity—have replaced ALL the rusty oil drums as our garbage cans in Crowley Park. This was a pilot program with the City.
- "No Confetti" Signs have been placed along the walkway and around the south pavilion to prevent confetti and micro litter from getting in the creek. This micro litter is very difficult to clean up.
- Yellow Bags yellow-bag dispenser has been placed at the south pavilion as a resource for extra garbage that may not fit in the new garbage cans. Another pilot program with the city.
- Clean Park Passport Program the Parks Department has launched a new program, Clean Park Passport Program. See a brief description of the program below:

The passport program is brand new and has 2 booklets – one for 1st grade and up and one for kindergarten and younger.

Both books are designed to educate children on the importance of taking care of our parks and community by learning about litter and how it could impact the environment. The booklets have fun activities for children to be hands on as well as challenges they can complete to earn prizes.

The challenges are simple tasks like have a snack at a park and clean up after yourself, pick up as many pieces of trash as your age, complete the Litter Quiz in the booklet, etc.

Kindergarten and below need to complete 5 activities and 1st graders and up have to complete 8 activities.

Once a child has completed the activities, he/she can bring their signed back page from the booklet to one of the recreation centers for a sling bag, water bottle, sticker and other fun prizes (including some goodies from local restaurants).

The city is extremely excited about this program and its potential positive impact. They feel strongly that bringing children into the Clean Park Initiative in a fun way will create life-long habits to help keep Richardson beautiful.

Several young people in our Crowley Park community have secured a Passport and have collected bags of garbage from our park and around the creek area. It seems to be working already. Trash is everyone's responsibility, but these young people make us proud by doing their part!!

#### TREES -

We will be working with the Parks Department this fall to replace trees that had to be removed due to oak wilt or trees that have not done well in the Shade the Trail program.

#### PARK IRRIGATION -

Crews continue to work hard at the park to keep irrigation in good working order. Problem areas have been around the pond and the corner of Honeysuckle and Blackberry.

#### **WILDFLOWERS -**

Park staff plant wildflower seeds in the fall to get beautiful wildflowers in the spring. While the flowers are beautiful, they come with additional traffic, etc to our neighborhood. We are working with the city on ideas to be able to enjoy the flowers in a less disruptive way. More to come on that.

#### THE POND -

Many of you wonder about the pond throughout the year and why it occasionally gets scummy-looking. The existing waterfall in the pond is meant to circulate the water very efficiently for our size pond and on most days works very well. Occasionally due to weather (especially the heat) or just the incidence of more algae, the pond appears scummy. The city has a pond expert visit the pond twice a month to inspect how things are functioning and looking. This size pond is too shallow for any fountain feature in the center of the pond. Our existing waterfall feature works much more effectively.

#### FLAG PROGRAM -

Crowley Park looks so beautiful and patriotic with flags flying on our major National Holidays. To continue to maintain this program, we need volunteers from our neighborhood to put out or pick up flags. If you are able and interested in helping, please contact Allen Walton. 
